

Revision List - aiming for a B grade

To achieve a B grade at GCSE your first priority is to maximise marks on D and C grade topics (check out the C grade checklist).

You'll then need to show good understanding in the following B grade topics...

B-grade Topics	Tick
Standard Form	
Repeated % change (compound interest)	
Reverse percentages	
Drawing quadratic/cubic graphs	
Cumulative Frequency	
Box plots	
Tree Diagrams	
Circle Theorems	
Trigonometry (on right angles)	
Stratified Sampling	

These topics are very likely to appear on one of your exam papers.

Remember...

- For a B grade you need to be looking at 100 marks over both papers - in other words 50%.

To get yourself over that 100 mark go and check out the A grade topic checklist - you may be able to pick up some valuable marks from those topics too.
