


### Common Issues

- Revising what you are confident with already








### **Develop your Memory**

Just reading through notes or exercise books the night before an exam won't work. Your brain is like a muscle. Exercise it to make it stronger.






### **Ebbinghaus Forgetting Curve**








### Methods of Revision

#### C.R.A.V.E.

- 1. Creativity The more creative your strategies the better and more enjoyable.
- 2. Repetition You will need to cover content multiple times before you can remember it. Organisation is key to this so you use your time efficiently.
- 3. Activity Try and make your learning as active as possible. Friends and family working with you can be even better.
- 4. Visual Use visual aids (pictures) to link with key words.
- 5. Environment Quiet and organised with all the equipment you need. No smart phones when working. Manageable chunks of time (25 min work, 5 min rest Also get some quality sleep & rest!

#### **Macbeth**

**Act One Scene Seven:** 

LADY MACBETH: "I would, while it was smiling in my face,/Have plucked my nipple from his boneless gums,/And dashed the brains out."



#### Meaning

Lady Macbeth's threat — whilst clearly imaginary and hyperbolic — is used to mock Macbeth's hesitation in killing King Duncan. She claims that she would murder her own child if she had promised him she would.

#### Method

Violent imagery Verbs

#### **Analysis/Effect**

• Her ruthless nature is accentuated by the speed with which she is willing to act – the verbs "plucked" and "dashed" both suggest swift, clinical movements. The contrast of the vulnerability connoted by "boneless" and the cruelty of the somewhat clinical "brains" amplify the gruesome nature of murdering the innocent.

#### **Context**

Lady Macbeth is the antithesis of a traditional subservient Jacobean female. She rejects her maternal and womanly instincts in favour of her desire for political success.



These produce 1 GCSE grade each


Each GCSE has no bearing on the other.
