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Mock Review and Next Steps Year 11

Year 11 students have had a busy few weeks sitting their mock exams. A huge well done to students for taking their exams seriously and for attending breakfast and lunchtime booster sessions each day. We hope that this practice run will prepare students for the real thing this summer. Teachers continue to provide a wide range of support; period 6 will resume in a slightly different format after half term as well as assertive mentoring sessions running up until April. Core subject period 6 sessions will run for half an hour on Mondays (English), Wednesdays (Maths) and Thursdays (Science).

Students will then be allocated an option subject period 6 to attend for half an hour after these sessions. We encourage all students to attend and make the most of the opportunities provided for them. In addition, we are running an Easter School revision programme for students to sign up to.

Year 11 students are attending regular assemblies to support them with exam preparation as well as topics related to wellbeing and next steps in terms of Post-16 options.

Behaviour Changes - The Oakwood Best

We are making some adjustment to our rewards and behaviour procedures at school. After half term, your child is in with a chance to receive an Oakwood Best (5 points) Award per lesson for continually being an outstanding Oakwood student. If students earn two or more of these in one day, they will be entered into a separate draw for some in school prizes.

Our detention system runs as a same day process. For example, two behaviour points is a 15-minute detention, three behaviour points is a 30-minute detention. After half term, we are also introducing a same day 60-minute detention for four or more behaviour points. If students fail to attend a detention, that they are told about, it will increase in time for the following day. Parents will be notified by a Class Charts announcement.

To enhance our learning environment and classroom experience we are also introducing the following. The Oakwood BEST - where students have to sit up straight, be silent, put their pens down, face the teacher and ensure they are listening. In our classrooms we expect students to be silent unless they are allowed to talk (at the discretion of the teacher). Finally, in the final five minutes in each classroom, staff will be ensuring students tidy away, are in perfect uniform, that they know where to go to for their next lesson and also conduct a learning review.

Year 9 Options

Our Year 9 students have now started their GCSE Options process, choosing subjects they wish to focus on from the start of Year 10 in September. This week all Year 9 students took part in the Options assembly, finding out about the subjects on offer and how they will need to make their choices. There are lots of new subjects on offer, including Health and Social Care, Business Studies, Computer Science, Sports Studies, and Hospitality & Catering, alongside GCSE Music, Art, Drama, Design, Spanish, History, Geography, Religious Studies and Triple Science.

All students will choose three subjects to study from the start of Year 10, as well as continuing with the core subjects of English, Maths, Science, PE and RE. All of the details are explained in the Options booklet that students brought home last Friday, and there will be lots of other support and guidance available to help students choose their options, building up to the Option Evening for parents and students on Thursday 21st March at 6pm.

All the staff at Oakwood are really looking forward to working with Year 9 students on the next step of their journey into Key Stage 4 and beyond.

Enrichment Activities

Since September, we have introduced "TOA Enrichment". This is a chance for students in Years 7-10 to take part in activities which will allow them to develop a range of skills which will develop their confidence and move forward into gaining excellent results at Oakwood.

Students have partaken in a range of activities, including careers assemblies with MP Tom Randall, author Lisa Williamson and Estate Agent James Humphries Stone. Further to this, students have been taking part in writing workshops, helping collect an impressive 800 tins of food for the Food Bank drive and retelling the stories of residents at Eden Lodge care home in Nicky Raffety's Intergenerational Project.

Students will continue to partake in a range of events for the rest of the academic year, with a celebration evening being planned for Monday 15th July.











Curriculum Plus

Since September 2023, the Redhill Academy Trust have introduced a new after school programme called Curriculum Plus. There is a huge drive for all the schools in the trust to get students involved in activities such as sports, drama, cooking and UNO club outside of learning time. Last term (September to December), we have had 587 students (78%) who have taken part in our Curriculum Plus programme.

Our Post 16 students hit the ground running in September and haven't looked back. With the biggest intake in year 12 since the centre opened, we now have 50 students on our campus studying a Level 3 Extended Diploma in both Sport and Health Social Care.

In October, all students were given the opportunity to take their one day Emergency First Aid Certificate and CPR training as part of Restart a Heart a Day. Students learnt lifesaving skills and the confidence to use them. This was followed by an inspirational and moving presentation from Cardiac Risk in The Young and The Alex Reid Memorial Foundation. We hope that through fundraising we can support our young community by offering cardiac screening in the months to come.

We have been fortunate to have guest speakers from the NHS and the University Campus of Football Business who have inspired our students towards an in-depth interest in their future careers, helping them identify their own strengths and developmental needs and motivating them to realise their dreams.

Theatre visits, university campus tours, football matches, mindfulness days, a Q & A with our local MP, visits from our alumni and work placements have also kept us busy and we are excited about further opportunities over the coming months.

Next academic year marks the launch of our new course T Level Education — Early Years which is perfect for anyone who wishes to work with young children in the future. At The Oakwood Academy, students are fortunate to be able to access a reserved place at the Redhill Academy Sixth Form. It is pleasing to report that over half of our current Year 11 students have applied to study there and we look forward to supporting their transition within the Redhill Trust.
